DUP News and History by Cherrie Barrow

The Canal Creek Camp of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers will meet January 8 at 11:00 a.m. in the Ballroom at the Old School Community Center. The lesson will be "Women Pioneer Hymn Writers," and the history will be given by Nedra Allred. In February, we will meet on Monday, February 5.

Anyone is welcome to join us as we learn about the early days of the Utah Territory and pioneer histories. Fortunately, much of Spring City's history has been recorded in *Life Under the Horseshoe*. The history of the building on Main Street known as the Soda Fountain, or currently, the Roots 89 Grill, is an interesting tale. The original building, constructed of lumber on this site, was Isaac E. Allred's drug store. He made his own ice cream and root beer, along with any medicines ordered by local doctors for people or animals. The store burned down in 1929, and a new brick building took its place called the Osborne Mercantile, later known as the Horseshoe Grocery.

Times were tough in the 1930s, and the Merc had been robbed several times by 1939. One night, Pratt Osborne was awakened by a call from Everett Strate, the co-owner of Strate's Garage across the street. Everett quickly told Pratt that he could tell there were some men in the Merc. Pratt jumped into his clothes, grabbed his .30-.40 Krag, running the block and a half to Strate's store across the street. His son, Devon, about 16 years old, also threw on his clothes, grabbed his .22 rifle (everyone hunted), headed north behind his dad and heard him yell, "Stop or I'll shoot!"

Several shots were exchanged, but by the time Devon arrived, the men had slipped out the back door, disappearing into the night. He recalled that two bricks were chipped by bullets, and that the Strate's Garage sign was shot through the middle. Devon said that the Merc was never robbed again.
