Did you know there is a way to sign up to receive notices of all public meetings involving Spring City public bodies in your email? Set up a subscription so you never miss a meeting notice or other posting. Search for the Utah Public Notice Website (or go to Utah.Gov and you will find it under Utah Division of Archives and Records Services). Once there, fill out the search form by typing in Spring City under "entity." That will bring up a list of notices that have been posted. Just click on one of the notices posted for a meeting of the City Council, and it will give you the option of subscribing, so you receive all future notices relating to City Council meetings in your email. You can do the same for the Planning and Zoning Commission. Subscribe so you don't miss a chance to participate in future meetings.

Are you interested in recycling? Recyclops is now servicing Spring City. They made a presentation in a recent Council Meeting, and they are looking for more customers so they can be more efficient in their collection operations. The monthly cost is not insignificant, but we were told you could join together with a couple of neighbors and set up one account, then split the cost among you.

Recyclops helps us deal with the negative impacts of our ever-increasing trash production. Shawn and Becca Symanski, who run the Sanpete operation, reported that in 2022 alone, Recyclops kept approximately 6.7 million pounds of materials from entering our landfills. The Canal Creek Camp of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers will hold our monthly meeting March 4 at 11 a.m. in the ballroom at the Old School Community Center. The lesson will be "Families of the Mormon Battalion" given by Cynthia DeGrey. The pioneer history will be given by Christi McGriff. Our next meeting will be April 1.

Spring City celebrates Founders Day on March 22, which is the day the James Allred family and a few others arrived at "Canal Creek," aka "the Allred Settlement" in 1852. Having arrived at Manti the previous fall to join their son, James T.S. Allred, in the spring the Allreds selected the site and began preparations for planting and building homes. James T.S. brought his log cabin from Manti, and two adobe homes were built. A year later in March 1853, Reuben W. Allred, the son of James, was called to be the first bishop of the settlement.

Raiding Sanpitch warriors soon threatened the pioneers' lives and livelihood, and because of the Walker War, the

settlement was abandoned until the spring of 1859. The Utes often raided other villages and captured children, who were later killed or sold. At some point during this time, Bishop Allred saved a little girl and adopted her into his family, naming her Rachel. This has become a favorite story about how this little girl saved the settlement from massacre. When hostilities increased,

Some of the squaws came to Reuben W. Allred's house and peering through the window told Rachel that the Indians were coming back to kill all the white folks in the settlement. For some time after this Rachel kept walking around the house crying bitterly. She finally told the other children the reason for her grief. At this time Spring Town consisted of but thirteen families or houses, so there were not many men in the settlement.

Children were sent out at once to tell every man the news so they could prepare to defend themselves and their property. To do this they drew in all the houses, placing them together for an attack. Although the Indians whooped and yelled, they neither killed nor drove off any animals at this time. So, by buying and thus saving the life of one little papoose, the lives of the whole settlement were spared.
