#### Mayor's Corner by Chris Anderson

Spring City is moving forward with a couple of significant projects. We are expanding our culinary water network, to meet pressure and flow standards and expand the reach of the system. We are also expanding our sewer service area. Both are significant projects that we have been working on for quite a while. Requests for bids on the water project have been sent out, and we expect to open bids and select contractors in May. The sewer project is in the final design stage, and invitations to bid are expected to be sent out in June.

Construction should begin on the water project by midsummer, and work on the sewer project is expected to start by early fall. We hope these projects enable Spring City to better keep up with growing demands.

We are pleased to announce that Spring City has new royalty. Ingrid Seegmiller is the new Miss Spring City and Emma Evans is her attendant. They are both outstanding young women, and we look forward to having them represent Spring City this year. Congratulate them when you see them.

Remember that Heritage Day is coming up the last Saturday of May, the 25th. #### Plans to Upgrade Culinary Water System in Spring City

Spring City is initiating a Culinary Water Improvement Project funded by the Drinking Water Board. This project will include the following:

- 1. Replacement of approximately 10,000 feet of water main pipes, including valves, fire hydrants, and service connections.
- 2. Construction of a new 5,000-gallon concrete tank.
- 3. Construction of a chlorination building.
- 4. Construction of approximately 11,000 feet of new transmission lines with upgrades to existing wells and meter stations.

Plans and specifications have been prepared by Sunrise Engineering and have been available since April 10 at http://www.sunrise-eng.com.

Spring City is now seeking bids for constructing the project. Sealed bids are due before 2 pm on May 15 at City Hall. After that time, bids will be opened and read aloud. For more information, use this OR code:

#### City Seeks Seasonal Employee for Public Works Department

Spring City is seeking to hire a seasonal employee to perform such duties as lawn care and upkeep of grounds using a variety of tools and equipment. This employee will also assist other employees and departments as required. The position does not include employee benefits.

The minimum qualifications are possession of a driver's license and ability to pass a drug test. The employee must also be able to work under a number of undesirable conditions, such as exposure to extreme weather and possibly hazardous materials, and operating potentially dangerous equipment. The job will require extensive walking and standing, as well as heavy lifting, periodic digging, and full-body exertion in operating equipment.

\*Please note that one of our teachers this month is David W. Allan, a world-famous scientist. During his 32 years in Book of Mormon. He has written two books: It's About Boulder, CO, he helped develop the official atomic clock timekeeping system for the USA and world. He spent many years helping to develop the GPS. His master's thesis gave birth to the Allan variance, which was used to characterize the atomic clocks needed for GPS. If you Google "Allan variance," you will get over three million results. The IEEE, the largest scientific publishing house in the world, in 2018 sent a historian to Allan's home in Fountain Green to record his oral history, found at https:// ethw.org/Oral-History:David W Allan.

In addition to science, David has done research on the Time (2014) and Time & Eternity, the End-Times & Beyond Revealed (2023). His books' website features both books at www.ItsAboutTimeBook.com. Allan gives the Lord credit for his several innovative inventions. His personal goal during his 88th trip around the sun is to share light and truth as the Lord gives it to him. Allan giving his explanation of the Semana Santa Stone, found in North America, depicting the Lord's infinite atonement.

#### **DUP News by Cherrie Barrow-Jones**

**DUP meeting.** The Canal Creek Camp of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers will hold their last meeting before the summer break on May 6 at 11:00 a.m. We will meet, as usual, in the ballroom of the Old School Community Center. The lesson, to be given by Sherrie Rigby, is entitled "St. Thomas, NV; Mormon Island, CA; Rockport, UT." The pioneer history will be given by Cherrie Jones. Come and enjoy friendship and a potluck luncheon. Our next meeting will be the second Monday in September.

Bake Sale. Our annual bake sale fundraiser will be held on Heritage Day, Saturday morning, May 25, at the Old City Hall Museum on Main Street. DUP bake sales have become a longtime Spring City tradition as a means of raising money for our various projects. If you would like to provide an item, please bring your donation, bagged or wrapped, by 9:00 a.m. Community support is very much appreciated, so even if you are not a member of DUP, please consider contributing something.

**Heritage Day.** Heritage Day with its popular home tour began in 1984 as the DUP and the Restoration Committee were raising money to save the old school built in 1899.

The Daughters purchased the school when it was condemned. It was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978 and several grants were obtained to combine with local fundraising in order to preserve the building.

Mormon Pioneer Village. The town of Spring City was listed as a "National Historical District" in 1980. It received this designation because it "reflects life in a nineteenth century Mormon village." In a Mormon village, homes were on the corner of each block, and the center of the block was devoted to livestock and gardens to support each family. Nearly every home in town was blessed with their own milk cow, chickens, and horses, as well as a few sheep and pigs. A large garden, granary, root cellar, fruit trees, barns, shed, outhouse, or other outbuildings completed the layout. The larger farming areas were located around the perimeter of the town. (*Life Under the Horseshoe*, p. 58)

**Tour Books.** The DUP museums have tour books for purchase. They provide information on the historic homes and families who settled Spring Town.
